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Homeowners in Franklin County can now print their tax bill at home

(Columbus, OH) Franklin County Ed Leonard announces that property owners can view and print their bill online by going to <http://Treasurer.Franklincountyohio.gov>

1st half property taxes are due January 21, 2014 and the paper bills will be in the mail on or before December 26, 2013, however, you can save time and ensure your payment will be received by the end of the year by going on line today.

“I am excited our website now provides taxpayers more information in a user-friendly format. Our taxpayers can print their tax bill from our website days before it would arrive in the mail. This is a great new convenience for those who might be out-of-town during the collection period or who want to pay their property taxes before the New Year for income tax purposes.” states Treasurer Ed Leonard.

Payments may be made in person at the Franklin County Treasurer’s Office 373 S. High St., 17th Floor from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm through January 21, 2014, in the drop box designated for tax payments located in the lobby of 373 S. High St., or at Heartland Bank. Payments may also be made online by e-check or credit card at <http://Treasurer.franklincountyohio.gov>. There is no cost to pay by e-check; however credit card payments are charged a 2.35% fee by the processing company that handles the transaction. Franklin County does not receive any portion of this fee.

By law, 2013 second half real estate tax payments paid after January 21, 2014 will be assessed a penalty regardless of whether or not the taxpayer received a bill. The Treasurer has no authority to waive penalties

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
